# Transition to school - visits!

Children can begin their preschool visits from 4-6 weeks prior to their  $5^{th}$  birthday. Our new entrant teacher will be in touch with you so that suitable times can be arranged. Most students have between 4 and 6 visits. Parents / Caregivers may stay if they wish.

During visits, Mrs Wilkinson will familiarize your child with the school, and classroom in general. Your child will experience many of the activities that are set up around the class, and will learn how the class operates. They will meet many new friends too - which all adds to the excitement! Your child may or may not join in immediately - that's fine - they'll be taking it all in and before long, they will engage and love it!
