SUNHATS & SUNBLOCK!

Term 1 is a '**no hat, no play'** term. Please ensure that your child comes to school each day with the correct style of sunhat – if you are needing a new hat, please see Sue in the office! Our classes do have a limited supply of sunblock. Parents are encouraged to send their children to school with sunblock or apply lotion before coming to school.

Bus contracts and passes

Mrs Matthewson is our school bus controller. She will always be your first point of call with any questions that you have about the bus. Part of the privilege of riding the school bus is that all students are required to sign a bus contract, relating to agreed student behaviour. This is going to be sent home with all bus students. It is awesome for parents to read through the contract and explain to our students about what being a good passenger means. **The cost for the Motueka bus is \$40 for one child - \$75 for a family**. If you pay by internet banking, please ensure you put the family surname as reference. This is significantly cheaper than driving a car each day – do your bit for the environment and consider using this service!

PAYMENT FOR BUS PASSES (MOTUEKA RUN) need to be made to the school office by MONDAY 12th FEBRUARY, 2024. If no payment is received by this date, students will not be able to travel on the service.

School uniform

The school has a compulsory uniform, and we ask that the correct items of clothing are worn. The uniform is as follows:

- Lower Moutere shirt purchased at Whitwells, Motueka
- Black shorts or black skirt from Kmart, Warehouse etc.

We ask that parents do not send students to school with multiple layers under uniforms. With the very warm weather at present, students do not need the extras. We also ask that the choice of shorts is straight black – while there are many variations with logos etc, the uniform is pure black shorts. The school does have a small selection of second hand uniforms – however the choice is reasonably 'slim' at present!

Bell times...

The staff begin teaching programmes at 8.50am. Having students in class and ready is so important to helping this get underway. When students arrive late to class, it is really hard on them, as they not only feel on the backfoot, they need to work extra hard to catch up with what everyone else is doing. The latest time to be in the school grounds would be 8.45, ensuring that students get a chance to set themselves up for success, have a runaround and be all set for the bell.



At the end of the day, the bell rings at 2.50pm, where the whole school is released together.


CELL PHONES at SCHOOL -

With the recent change in ruling for cell phones at school, we will continue with our current practice of ...

- 1. We recognise that some students need a cell phone for after school activities and checking in with parents.
- 2. Cell phones can be brought to school then must be handed in to the class teacher. These will be stored safely at school.
- 3. Where a cell phone is found on a student and has not been handed in, we will hold the cell phone in the school office for collection.
- 4. If a student continually breaches this, they will be asked to either keep the phone at home.
