## Daffodil Day

Today was about dressing up, having some fun and raising a little bit of money for the Cancer Society New Zealand. The school raised \$265, so a BIG thankyou to everyone!

The Cancer Society is the largest private funder of cancer research in New Zealand. We know research is vital to finding a cure and improving outcomes for the approximately 28,000 New Zealanders diagnosed with cancer every year.

In the past ten years, the Cancer Society has invested over \$50 million in cancer research, that has improved the prevention, detection, and treatment of different types of cancer. This research aims to save lives and help New Zealanders live longer following a diagnosis.



## The importance of being at school on time

I want to take a moment to talk about something that can have a big impact on your child's day: arriving at school on time.

We all know mornings can be a rush but arriving just five minutes before the school bell rings at 8:50 am makes a world of difference. This isn't about being overly strict; it's about giving your child the best possible start to their day.

That extra five minutes allows children to:

- **Settle in:** They can catch up with their friends and teachers and put their bags away without feeling rushed.
- **Prepare for learning:** This brief window of time helps them transition from home mode to school mode, so they are mentally ready when the first lesson begins.
- **Reduce anxiety:** Rushing in right as the bell rings can be stressful for some children, making it harder for them to focus for the rest of the morning.

When students arrive calm and ready, the whole school benefits from a positive and settled start.

# Winter Sports "Racket n Roll"

Last Friday, as part of our winter sports programme, Upper Moutere — with support from Sport Tasman — launched the very first "Racket n Roll" option. This option was created especially for students who sometimes find it hard to engage with traditional team sports. The Kaupapa of the day was simple: to give Tamariki the chance to be active in a way that feels right for them, while catering for diversity and encouraging inclusion so that every child felt welcome.

Throughout the day, students rotated through four activities: Badminton, Pickleball, Bowling, and Challenge Stations. Each rotation was made up of short, structured activities, but with a twist — Tamariki were encouraged to adapt the rules, change the way the game was played, and choose how they wanted to experience success. Some chose to be competitive against others, while others set personal goals and competed against themselves.

The feedback from parents was incredibly positive. One parent shared, "Yesterday was run really well. I loved that the Tamariki didn't need any pre-requisite skills, just came as they are, and could be as competitive or non-competitive as they wanted." Another commented on the value of student choice and voice: "They had autonomy to change the games up, and everybody could participate at a level they were comfortable with. The Sport Tasman staff were really engaging and asked open-ended questions so that the Tamariki could extend or change things up." Perhaps the strongest endorsement came from a student who discovered a new passion:

"I've never played badminton before — I love it now! Where can I sign up to play it?"

The result was a fun-filled day where every child could find their own way to enjoy being active, build confidence, and celebrate movement on their own terms — a great example of inclusive sport that values diversity.


