Thank you to the large number of parents who attended the parent teacher interviews last week – one of the most significant factors in student achievement is the involvement of parents in the education of their child. We were pleased to see over 60 percent of parents booking interviews. Taking an active interest in your child's education and supporting them with next learning steps and the challenges they face, cannot be understated.

### **Full STEM Ahead!**

What an incredible community we live in — thank you so much for the amazing response to our recent shout-out for tools! Thanks to your generosity, we no longer have to raid Stu's shed, and our students are well-equipped for their STEM builds.

Our Evolocity teams are making great progress. Students have been hard at work stripping down two vehicles to design and build their own electric machines. Our girls' engineering team is having their bike cut and welded — we can't wait to see what they create! Their regional competition will take place in October at the Kartsport track in Nelson. A special thank you to school parent Haig and Evolocity expert Mark for your ongoing support of our Evolocity programme. We couldn't do it without you!

Meanwhile, our Aquabot teams will soon begin practicing in the school pool. They'll be navigating their bots through a series of underwater challenges in preparation for the regional competition, also set for October.

Last week, we were truly "full STEM ahead" with the RoboCup Junior robotics trials. We have selected 6 students to participate in the National Robocup Jr Competition held at Nelson Intermediate on August 10. They are: Valentina Walterfang, Olive Thomas, Sofia Ilton, Olivia Watene, Sol Cruse and Sam Stott. This national competition demands a high level of skill, innovation, and teamwork. Congratulations to the LMS teams who have qualified to represent us at Nelson Intermediate School on Sunday, 10 August — a fantastic achievement!

Looking across into the Arts field, we have registered our Matariki sculptures into the Art Science Fair at Founders Heritage Park on 19/20 August.

Finally, if possible we are also after:

- A hacksaw to cut through metal as part of STEM.
- We really need an R2D2 figurine or LEGO figure to be part of the Robocup presentation ... Will be returned!
- Any Star Wars or Sponge Bob costumes that might fit 10-11 year olds. Will be returned!

We are actively exploring how STEM is being integrated across the school from New Entrants to Year 8 and looking at how best to support and resource this exciting area of learning. Stay tuned - we'll be sharing regular updates as

our STEM journey grows!

STEM is an acronym that stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. It refers to a field of study and a curriculum that integrates these four disciplines, often emphasizing hands-on learning and problemsolving. STEM education aims to equip individuals with the knowledge and skills needed to succeed in a rapidly evolving, technology-driven world. Here's a breakdown of each component:

#### • Science:

Encompasses the study of the natural world, including biology, chemistry, physics, and earth science.

#### Technology:

Focuses on the application of scientific knowledge to create tools, processes, and systems.

#### • Engineering:

Involves the design, construction, and analysis of structures, machines, and systems.

#### Mathematics:

Provides the foundational language and tools for understanding and modelling the world around us.

STEM education is not just about learning separate subjects, but also about integrating them to solve complex problems and fostering critical thinking, creativity, and innovation.


