## Swimming season has WIMMING SEASON SOON HAS Started

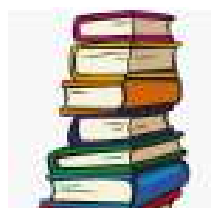


Swimming has started! The keys  for the pool are now on sale from the office. Cost for school families is \$80 for the season. The last day to purchase these is Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> December. (There is a pool rules form for completion). A wee request ... if you are the last to use the pool, please pop the cover back on ... it not only helps with the warmth of the water, it also keeps the chlorine level stable (the sun zaps it!).

## Bus Fees and Motec Fees 2026

For a long time we have managed to keep both the school bus fees and Motec fees at a low cost to our school families. As with everything these are increasing next year. The bus fees will be \$55 for one child and \$100 for more than one child.

MOTEC fees have also fallen victim to increased costs too. For a significant number of years, we have absorbed the majority of this (full cost is \$170). We are unable to fully subsidise this to the same level next year and need to increase this to \$120 per student. This covers the cost of all take home materials – except food items. If you are concerned about payment, please contact Sue in the school office to discuss further.

## School Payments


